Dear Fellow Residents,

On March 16 we signed a 30 year lease for 19,200 square feet of space at 1373 Veterans Memorial Highway. This space, which we plan on occupying in February/March 2018, will be a major improvement over our current location. It is less expensive per square foot, has lower yearly increases than our current space and will be fitted out to our standards. After looking at space around Hauppauge/Islip since the Summer of 2015 we felt this space will best serve the community for a generation of library users.

The space, located in the Matrix Corporate Park, is easily accessible from either direction on Veterans Memorial Highway and from Spartan Lane. There will be more meeting rooms, quiet study spaces, a teen area, more comfortable seating, a technology lab and much more. The Library Staff is still developing the plans for the new space and we look forward to sharing news about it as it gets finalized.

The land at Hidden Pond Park remains ours at this time. No decision has been made on plans for the property. We feel the need to focus on opening our new space at 1373 Veterans Memorial Highway and will determine what will come of the one acre parcel in the future.
