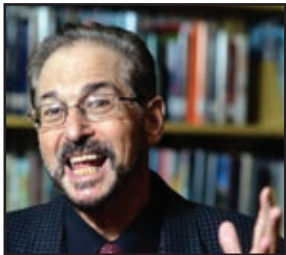
**CONGA: TRIBUTE TO GLORIA ESTEFAN AND MIAMI SOUND MACHINE HPA3137**
