At the June Board meeting a number of people attended and expressed their concerns about Hidden Pond Park and offered ideas for a different solution to the Library's building needs. This includes working with a commercial realtor to explore all available land and developed property for sale and lease in the Town of Islip portion of the Hauppauge School District. 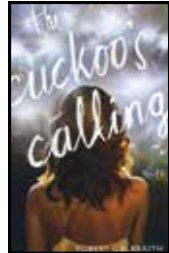

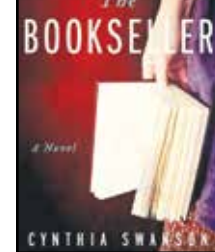

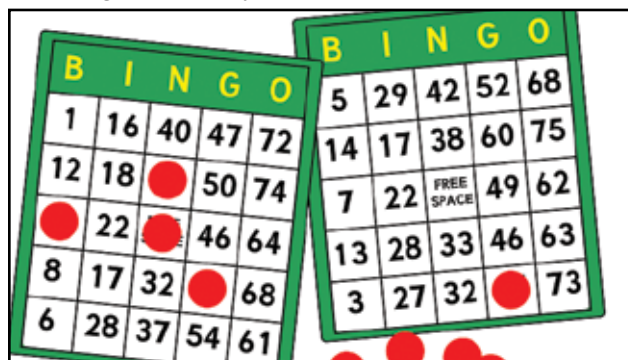
## DESIGN A BOOKMARK CONTEST
