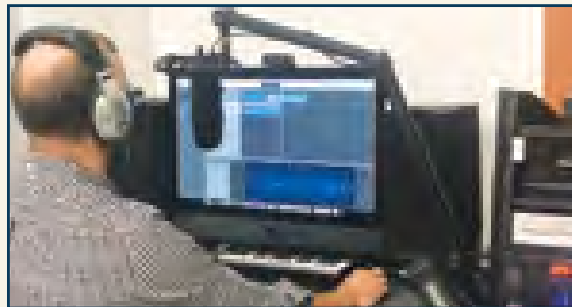

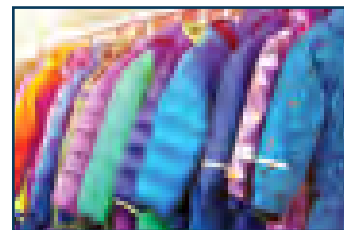
RECORD YOUR STORY WITH THE STORYCORPS APP
