




Cloud Library offers popular and bestselling ebooks that may not be immediately available elsewhere. Download them directly to

tion Center are also offered. Adult learners can further their academic and career goals with professional resume writing help and TASC test preparation.










SURREAL COVID-19 COLLAGE/DRAWING Tuesday, July 7, 7:00pm

LIBRARY ELECTION, JUNE 9

The Hauppauge Public Library will be having an election for two trustee positions on June 9 via absentee ballot that the Hauppauge Union Free School District is running. Governor Cuomo via Executive Order allowed the Library to request our vote be held along with the School District who graciously agreed. The Library thanks the Board of Education, Superintendent Dennis O'Hara, and Jacqueline I. Pirro, Assistant Superintendent for Business & Operations and their staff for helping us through this.

The Library Board of Trustees have frozen the tax appropriation request to the amount requested last year. Therefore, no vote is needed on the budget for 2020. The Board of Trustees have also instituted a hiring freeze until December 31, 2020.

Expect to receive a mailing from the school district that will have our two trustee positions up for vote, along with the school budget and Board of Education races. All questions about the vote should be directed to Lori DeGeorge, District Clerk.

HELPING CENTRAL ISLIP-HAUPPAUGE VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE CORPS



In mid-April the Central Islip-Hauppauge Volunteer Ambulance Corps received 25 face shield kits manufactured with help from the Hauppauge Public Library. The Library, along with many public libraries in Suffolk. participated in a project coordinated by the Suffolk Cooperative Library System in the printing of face shields. The Library lent its MakerBot 3D printer to the Suffolk Cooperative Library System's "printer farm." The farm had 109 printers going to manufacture face shields for Stony Brook Hospital and many healthcare organizations around the County.

> "When these supplies were nearly impossible to source." Matthew Bollerman. Chief Executive Officer of the Hauppauge Public Library stated. "the Library joined forces with others in Suffolk to make needed PPE." The project has halted as needed supplies have become easier to source. In total, over 5,000 face shields were manufactured and distributed.
