CARDS OF HOPE VOLUNTEER PROJECT



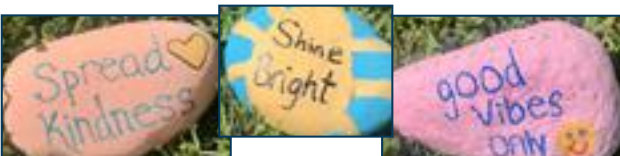
