Students are asked to write about what it takes to make the world a better place. Make sure to include what it took to "make it happen" and write a **story**, **an essay**, **poem**, **or story board (comic strip)** that highlights this concept.

Who is eligible?: Students in grades 1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> attending school in the Hauppauge SD and those attending private or parochial schools served by the Hauppauge Public Library.

## Topic: What does it take to make a difference and make the world a better place?

Submissions: All entries must be submitted through Google Classroom following the <u>link</u> with the join code: hil5v7h. To keep the entry process efficient, please have students complete Step #1 (Entry Form) and Step #2 (Essay Submission) at the same time.

Prizes: 1st, 2nd, and Honorable Mention awards will be given to students in four grade-level groups

1st grade & 2nd grade / 3rd grade & 4th grade / 5th grade & 6th grade / 7th grade & 8th grade



Students who participate will be invited to share their writing pieces during a virtual library celebration. Rules:

- On the TOP of your entry: your name, address, phone number, grade, teacher's name, school name & address
- Stories, essays, or poems must be typed and double-spaced
- Please give your story, essay, poem, or storyboard a title
- Writing pieces should be no longer than five (5) typed pages
- Storyboards can be hand-drawn on one side of a sheet of paper, no larger than 8.5 x 14
- Storyboards should include **both** a picture and **text or speech bubbles** and must be uploaded to the submission assignment
- ALL Entries must be submitted on Google Classroom by Monday, March 13, 2023
