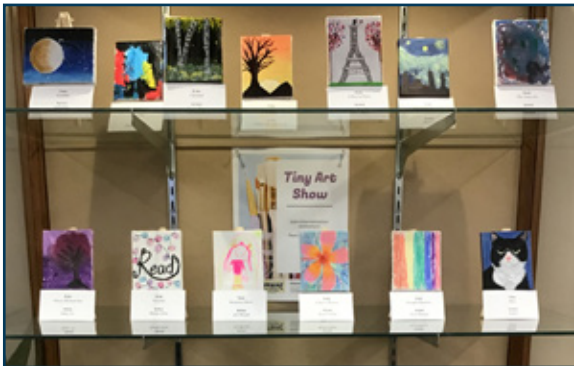


The library will be a collection site for Toys for Tots. Donations of new, unwrapped toys can be dropped off inside the library.

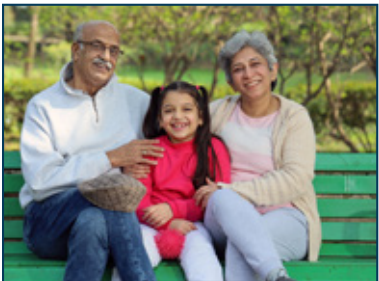


DESIGN A BOOKMARK CONTEST
